ORGANIZATION

Chinmaya Vidyalayas are run under the auspices of the Central Chinmaya Mission Trust in different parts of the country. The Vidyalaya in each place is administered by a Managing Committee consisting of local members of the Chinmaya Mission and other people interested in the cause. The school at Kasaragod runs classes from Kindergarten to Senior Secondary level.

In a growing child, individuality unfolds over the years stage by stage. His/Her awareness and understanding, abilities and capacities unfold as he/she becomes more and more aware of our world and gradually moves from the dim consciousness of infancy through the dreamy days of childhood, to the intellectual awareness of adolescence and beyond to adulthood. We should assist in this awakening process in the healthiest possible way, by bringing to the child the right kind of educational nourishment. This is what Chinmaya Vidyalayas aim at with sincerity in the best interests of the children and their future.

AIMS & OBJECTIVES

The primary objective of Chinmaya Vidyalaya is

1. To offer children a value-based and holistic education, which paves the way for an integrated development of their physical, mental, intellectual and spiritual aspects of their personality, which is enriched by the knowledge of Indian culture, enhanced by patriotism and a universal outlook.
2. To give a practical and judicious combination of academic excellence, extra-curricular pursuits, character building and personality development.
3. To mould children into young men and women of moral strength who can face the challenges of modern life with a smile and make a difference in the world by their positive contribution.

The aim of the institution is also to bring about the harmonious blending of the traditional and the progressive methods of education as a tool to achieve the all-round development of the personality of the child. Our endeavour is to "create free human beings who are able to impart in themselves purpose and direction to their lives". Our teaching methods and subject-matter are so evolved that they can develop, harmonise and bring together the power of thought, feeling and action in the child. When this integration of head, heart and hand is brought about, the base will have been laid for mental adaptability, initiative and moral strength in adult life. Inshort, our aim is to impart the best of education with utmost care, love and understanding with a view to instilling in these young minds, moral and ethical values, strength of character, discipline, national outlook, firm faith in all religions, and an abiding spirit of service and sacrifice and thus help and encourage them to develop a healthier and broader outlook on life.

GENERAL INFORMATION, RULES AND REGULATIONS

I AFFILIATION

The Vidyalaya is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi.

II SCHOOL CURRICULUM

a) **BALAVATIKA (Kindergarten):**

On the basis of NEP 2020, we have modified the **Balvatika (KG)** syllabus. Retaining all the good aspects of the previous syllabus, we implemented a more child-friendly method to enable the child to acquire the writing skills at **Balvatika (KG)** level.

The **Balvatika** (kindergarten) section has an exclusive park for the Kids. There is also a special skill-development park attached to it. Spacious play rooms, lunch hall etc. are its attractions.

b) **E-learning with interactive board, based on the latest technology is introduced from the academic year 2010-2011 from Balvatika-II (LKG) to XII. All our class rooms from Balavatika-I (Pre Kindergarten) to Std. XII are rendered 'SMART'.**

c) **The curriculum for classes I to V includes:**

e) Text Books, Note Books, etc.

The school arranges for the supply of all text books, note books,

badges and belts. Parents are requested to obtain these only from the school to ensure uniformity. **Advance amount towards these materials is to be paid in January. Text books will be provided in full sets only. If any student desires of using 2nd hand/old text books should intimate the stores department about it in writing before 31st January.**

Parents who intend to take T.C. of their wards need not pay the advance. All those who have paid the advance are bound to take the items for which the amount has been paid. Refund is not permissible.

f) Parents are advised to procure only the prescribed pattern of shoes/rainy season foot wear. Parents are allowed to buy these from any shop of their choice but should stick to the pattern/model. However, we found PARAGON FOOT WEAR is one of the best quality brands. Sample of the approved foot wear is displayed in the school office.

III EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Several extra-curricular activities have been introduced which are designed to develop the all-round personality of the students. Moral instruction, physical education, yoga, lessons in histrionics, debate, music, dance, drawing and painting etc. are imparted to the students. Modern audio visual rooms have already been in use. Computer training for all the students of Std. I to XII is provided under Work Education Scheme. Science Club, Eco Club, Philately Club, Social Science Club, Nallapadam Club, Mathematics Club, Seed Club, Literary Club, Sanskrit Club and Computer Science Club are also functioning. The School has a unit of the Association of the Kasaragod Amateur Taekwondo (Karate) for girls and boys on the Campus.

Special Classes in Skating, Chess, Dance, Music, Tabla, Violin, Keyboard, Yakshagana, Swimming, Painting & Drawing for students are run after the school hours on request from the parents.

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Our Vidyalaya is recognised as a Special Chapter of SPICMACAY (Society for the Promotion of Indian Classical Music & Culture Amongst Youth) which exposes our students to outstanding exponents of Classical Music, Dance and other Art forms from all over India. Top artistes of national-international repute are brought to the campus for lecture-cum-demonstrations.

IV SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

General proficiency prizes are given to the top students of all Classes. In Classes XI & XII subject proficiency prizes are given to encourage academic excellence among students. Many scholarships are awarded to meritorious students on merit-cum-means basis, in association with CCMT Education Cell, Coimbatore.

V ADMISSIONS AND WITHDRAWALS

The minimum age for admission to **Balvatika-I** (Pre KG) and Std. I is completion of 3 and 6 years as on March 31st of the year of admission respectively. Parents desirous of getting their children admitted to the school are requested to get them registered and obtain the prospectus and the application form on payment of Rs.200/-. Registration, however, is no guarantee of admission. The child has to sit for an assessment test and appear for an interview on the appointed date and time except in the case of **Balvatika-I** (Pre-KG) & **Balvatika-II** (LKG) admissions. For admission to **Balvatika-I** (Pre-KG) & **Balvatika-II** (LKG) there will be an interview with the parents along with the candidate. Admission will be made subject to availability of seats.

Students of Balvatika-III (UKG) who have successfully completed their Balvatika (KG) course should seek fresh admission in Std I. For this, the parents should adhere to the admission date schedule notified by the school. Non-adherence can imply that the ward does not need the seat in Std I. They are to bring the convocation certificates at the time of admission.

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Application forms duly filled in may be submitted on the stipulated date along with the **original birth certificate and a copy of it.**

Students coming from other schools should bring their transfer certificates. New students must be introduced personally by their parents/guardians who will be responsible for their regularity of attendance and payment of fees. The right of admission is reserved with the Management and the decision of the Management in this regard is final.

Admission to the higher classes is subject to the availability of seats, performance in the assessment and submission of T.C. T.C produced from foreign countries must be countersigned by the Indian Embassy of the country concerned.

Admission to Class XI will normally be taken up after the declaration of Class X results (SSE) of the CBSE. The rules and regulations will be put up on the notice board immediately after Class X results (SSE).

Transfer Certificate will be given only on the basis of a written application in the prescribed form, (available at the Reception Counter) to be submitted at least a week in advance by the parent/guardian. However, if a letter regarding the urgency is produced from the school where the student is seeking admission, Transfer Certificate will be issued on the third day of application. It will be issued, however, only to those who have fully settled their dues. The Management of Chinmaya Vidyalaya has decided to collect the following fee from students who will take the T.C. during the academic session.

First 7 working days - One month Tution fee

Between 8th and 15th - 1 month Tuition fee &

Working day Special fee (1st Term)

16th working day onwards - 1st Term fee

HOWEVER, FEES ONCE PAID WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.

VI EXAMINATIONS AND HOLIDAYS

From Standard I to VIII there will be series of test & two terminal Exams. For standard X and XII there will be two preboard Exams in addition to the Board Exam. Ordinarily, the session commences in the first week of June and ends on 31st March. There will be about a week of holidays each during Onam and Christmas, and two months summer vacation in April and May, besides other public holidays as notified. **There will be coaching classes in March/April for classes X & XII. Attendance is compulsory.**

VII RULES OF PROMOTION

The promotion of a student to the next higher standard depends on his/her overall performance during the entire session. Since due credit is given to multiple assignment, subject enrichment, portfolio, periodic tests, I term, II term examinations, it is very essential that the student takes all the tests and completes all assignments in time. If a student is absent for any of the above, he/she will forgo the marks allotted. **Re-tests or re-assignments will not be held.**

For a pass, from one standard to the next higher standard a student must get atleast 33% marks in each subject. Also a student must get atleast 75% attendance. The decision of the school authorities in the matter of promotion shall be final. A student who fails twice in the same class will be asked to leave the school.

FOR CLASS VI to VIII

- * School will conduct Annual Examinations for 80 marks in each subject covering 100% syllabus of the subject.
- * Students have to secure 33% marks out of 80 marks in all subjects.

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- * Students have to secure 33% marks out of overall 20 marks (Internal Assessments) earmarked for each subject. Internal Assessment will be made by periodic tests, notebook submissions & subject enrichment activity.

FOR CLASS IX to XII

The school conducts Half Yearly/Term examination for classes IX to XII. Final Examination for the classes X & XII is conducted by CBSE.

For IX & XI the final examination will be as per CBSE norms. There is a separate minimum for theory as well as practicals. Eligibility for promotion is 33% in theory and 33% in practicals. Students studying in standards I-XII must also get good grades in the Work education (Computer Science), Physical & Health Education and Art & General Education.

VIII EXAMINATION REPORTS AND RESULTS

Answer papers of all exams except those of Annual (IInd term) Examinations will be given back within ten days of the examination. Parents are requested to watch out for this and contact the school authorities if the time limit is not kept up. When the answer sheets are distributed, a deadline is set for presenting any grievances for redressal. No change in marks of the answer sheets will be effected after the deadline.

No arrangement will be made for special tests/assessments for absentees before or after the time fixed for tests/assessments. An absentee will forgo the marks allotted to such test/assessments. Students absent for examinations without grave reasons will not be considered for promotion.

Progress report will be shown to the parents after every examinations on the Open House. Parents are requested to go through the reports carefully and return them immediately, duly signed.

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The results of the IInd Term examinations in respect of classes I to VIII will be declared and put up on the School Notice Board in the second week of April. Class IX and XI result will be announced in the 3rd week of March.

IX (a) HOUSE SYSTEM

To instil in pupils the art of self-discipline and self-governance and to encourage a spirit of healthy competition among them, they are organised into five Houses as stated below: (Given within brackets are the names of the colours attached to each House)

Ganga (Green); **Alakananda** (Blue); **Bhagirathy** (Yellow); **Cauvery** (Purple); **Yamuna** (Orange).

(b) SCOUTS AND GUIDES

The school has a Scout troop (for boys) and a Guide troop (for girls), who are actively involved in various creative activities.

X SCHOOL HOURS

Balvatika-I (Pre-KG) to IV: Saturday Holiday

Balvatika-I (Pre-KG): 9.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. (Monday to Friday)

Balvatika-II (LKG) to VIII: 9.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. (Monday to Friday)

STD IX to XII : 8.45 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. (Monday to Friday)

STD V to VIII : 9.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. (Saturday)

STD IX to XII : 9.30 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. (Saturday)

(N.B.: Special classes may be held outside school hours with advance intimation. Occasionally, Saturday afternoons will have special programmes, which will also be intimated in advance).

XI SCHOOL DISCIPLINE

The following Rules of discipline are to be strictly followed:

1. The School Diary should be brought to the school everyday including examination days.
2. Students must be in the Vidyalaya premises 5 minutes before the first bell. Late-comers should not enter the class without the Principal's permission. They should also get the late

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- attendance recorded in the school diary signed by their parents.
3. The school uniform, washed and ironed, must be worn on all school days and at all school functions. If a student is not in the prescribed uniform, he/she may be fined/sent home and the responsibility will lie with the parents. **Students shall wear uniform on all formal occasions such as special classes and functions on holidays also.**
 4. Students shall speak only English in the school premises except in language classes. Defaulters are liable to be fined.
 5. On meeting teachers/authorities for the first time in a day whether in the school or outside, students shall greet them, saying, 'HARI OM' with folded hands.
 6. When a teacher/distinguished visitor enters the class, students should stand up, greet him/her saying 'HARI OM' with folded hands and remain standing till the teacher/visitor takes his/her seat or asks them to sit down.
 7. **Gold jewellery or any other ornaments like bangles, anklets, pearl chains, talisman etc. should not be brought to the school. In the case of girls, if any one is to wear simple ornament on earlobes, it should be limited to one pair of ear studs only and not any other decorative type including on birthdays. Students should not apply eyeliner or lipstick while coming to school. Unauthorised books, magazines, toys or such other articles are not to be brought to the school. Only students of Std. V and above can wear wrist watches. Smart watches and fancy watches are not allowed.**
 8. Students are not allowed to meet parents or visitors or to leave the school premises during school hours without the prior permission of the Principal/Vice Principal/Headmistress.
 9. **Students are themselves responsible for the safety of their personal belongings like books, writing materials, lunch boxes, umbrellas, etc.**

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10. Students are strictly forbidden to write or scribble on school walls or furniture or disfigure the class-rooms or damage any property. Parents/Guardians will have to compensate for any such damage done to school property by their wards. Moreover, disciplinary action may also be taken against them.
11. Parents are requested not to give any money to their children without specific purpose. They are also requested not to entrust the payment of fees to their wards.
12. Students having full day session should preferably bring lunch from home. In case they wish to buy it from school canteen, they should obtain the lunch coupon before 10.30 a.m. They should not leave the school campus during the recess time, without the prior permission from the Principal.
13. **ONLY VEGETARIAN FOOD SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO THE SCHOOL. VIOLATORS WILL BE FINED.**
14. For going to the mosque on Fridays an application in duplicate should be submitted to the Principal in June.
15. Giving tips/gifts to the School Staff is against the rules of the Vidyalaya.
16. Every student must take part in school games and other activities unless declared physically unfit or exempted by the Principal. Weekly Balavihar classes are also compulsory for all students.
17. While going to/coming from the assembly, P.T. or any other classes, or to the dining hall, students should walk in line silently.
18. Students up to Std. IV should use only pencil, and not pen. All students should be regular in submitting home work assignments. Disciplinary action will be taken for failure to do so. Parents are requested to ensure regularity in submission of home-work by their wards..
19. A record of the addresses of parents/guardians is maintained in the school office. Any change of address or telephone number should be communicated to the school without delay.

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20. **The School reserves the right to dismiss a student on grounds of irregular attendance, habitual lack of leave application, disobedience to teachers, refusing to sing school prayers, national anthem and other prescribed songs and any kind of malpractice or objectionable behaviour or conduct, not in keeping with the good reputation and principles of the school, within the premises or elsewhere.**
21. Parents are requested to co-operate in the school work taking due interest in the progress of their children and enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline. **Parents should check the School Diary daily and ensure that the homework assigned is completed by the children. In addition, parents should sign for all remarks and information given in the Diary without fail.**
22. Parents/guardians/escorts are not allowed to walk into any classrooms. They may leave their wards at the school gate/varandah from where the Ayahs will escort them into the respective class (wherever necessary).
23. Parents who wish to seek information or make any representation should do so by meeting the President or the Principal, and not the Class Teacher.
24. **Parents who wish to speak to the Class Teacher regarding the progress of their children shall do so only after school hours between 4-00 p.m. and 4-20 p.m. on working days, with the prior permission of the Principal/Vice Principal/Headmistress.**

VISITING HOURS TO MEET THE PRINCIPAL:

Parents can meet the Principal between **2.00 p.m.** and **3.30 p.m.** on all working days. However, in case of special issues, parents can meet him on prior appointment.

25. No private tuition by the Vidyalaya staff will be permitted without the prior approval of the Management. Parents are requested not to approach teachers directly.

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26. **It is essential that all parents attend the Open House meeting whenever held. Failure to do so without sufficient reason will be treated as a lapse on the part of the parents in discharging their obligation.**
27. Attendance/participation of all mothers in the Mothers' Day celebration is important.
28. Children are not permitted to sport "MEHANDI" beyond inside palm. Applying of Nail Polish and TATTOOS are also forbidden. In the event of any violations, parents are liable to be summoned and the student concerned will be fined.
29. No student is permitted to drive any type of vehicles-four wheelers/two wheelers/electric vehicles except bicycle to the school on a working day/special class days or during any special function.
30. **Students shall never bring MOBILE PHONES (Cellphones) into the campus either on working days or holidays. Violators will be sternly dealt with and their cellphones will be confiscated and will be returned only on the last working day of the academic year. No excuse or exigency will be entertained for earlier return under any pressure from any sources, under any circumstances. This is a strict order from the management to the students. Parents will please take note of this.**
31. **Distributing/accepting chocolates or sweets inside school campus is strictly prohibited. Violators will be fined. Their parents are liable to be summoned, too. (i) A student whose birthday is to be celebrated may gift a new book/books to the school library and the book/books so gifted will be kept in a separate 'Birthday Gift Almirah' in the library. (ii) He/She will be permitted to wear colour dress. Such dress should not be too tight nor too gaudy. It should be decent and modest in all respects (Ethnic wear). Violator's parents are liable to be summoned. The colour dress will be permitted only on the exact birthday if it**

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falls on a working day. In the event of somebody's birthday falling on a holiday the colour dress will not be permitted on a working day coming before/after the exact birthday. (iii) He/She will be given a Birthday card and (iv) wished Happy Birthday by the Class/Assembly.

32. Entrusting a child to the School implies that parents agree to adhere to the rules and regulations of the School. They are requested to see that their children also abide by these regulations.
33. **All students should sing the school prayer and other prescribed songs and anthems.**
34. Plastic carry bags, chocolates & toffees are prohibited on campus.
35. **Students should wear the identity card on all working days and on other formal occasions including special class days, etc. Identity card should be worn from home till back home (i.e. right from the moment student leaves home in the morning, till they get back home in the evening).**
36. **Students and teachers are not allowed to exchange gifts or greeting cards, whatsoever.**

XII STUDENTS WELLNESS

While at school, in the event of any student showing signs of illness, we have 'Wellness Rooms' in each block with First Aid facilities. However in case a child gets injured warranting hospitalisation, immediate steps will be taken by the school after informing/consulting the parents/guardians. The expenses for such medical care will be borne by the parent concerned.

XIII LEAVE OF ABSENCE

1. Leave of absence is not granted except on written application provided in the School Diary, from parent or guardian. In case of long leave on grounds of illness a medical certificate will have to be produced along with a separate leave application.

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2. Absentees shall produce the School Diary with the relevant columns of the leave record duly filled in and signed by the parent/guardian.
3. **Students of classes X, XI and XII should meet the Principal along with their parents on the day they come to the school after their absence.**
4. Children will not be allowed to go home during class hours except in case of death in the family, casualty, reporting sick on the campus or such exigencies.
5. A student absenting continuously without leave for more than 15 working days will be removed from the rolls. Re-admission will entail payment of a penalty of Rs.500/-.
6. Students must be present in the school on the re- opening day. Absentees after any long holidays will have to produce Medical Certificate if such leave is not got sanctioned in advance.
7. No student suffering from contagious or infectious diseases will be allowed to attend the Vidyalaya. A student returning to school after suffering from such a disease should produce a fitness certificate from a Regd. medical practitioner.

XIV CHINMAYA DIGVIJAYAM (Miniature Museum)

Chinmaya Vidyalaya, Kasaragod has set up a museum 'CHINMAYA JEEVAN DARSHAN' - a unique museum depicting the life and message of Pujya Gurudev Swami Chinmayanandaji, on the campus. The idea is to make the students, members of the Vidyalaya staff, parents and public in general aware of the life and message of Pujya Gurudev and his great contributions in the field of spirituality and culture in India and abroad. This cute museum was inaugurated by Pujya Guruji H. H. Swami Tejomayanandaji on 07-10-2013. You are welcome to visit this museum-CHINMAYA DIGVIJAYAM.

XV KIDS' LIBRARY

A beautifully designed, colourful library exclusively for the L.P. children, has been set up at Tapovan block (Top Floor) on the Vidyalaya Campus. This library has a pleasant and cosy ambience for children to enjoy the company of lovely, pictorial books, select books of their choice with the guidance of a teacher-and read them to their heart's content!

XVI MAIN LIBRARY

The school has a spacious library with a large collection of books. Library periods are provided for in the timetable and students of class V and above will be issued books from the library.

Students should maintain a record of the extra readings done by them, in a separate note book. This will be checked by the Librarian. The 'best readers' are awarded annually, encouraging the reading habits among the students.

XVII MATHEMATICS LABORATORY

Set up in accordance with the directions of CBSE, this maths lab helps the children to understand the basic concepts easily and to be effective in enhancing the intellectual development.

XVIII (a) SCIENCE PARK

A Science Park has been set up on the Vidyalaya campus (on the top floor of CBC block). The purpose of the Science Park is to promote a scientific temper among the young minds and to boost them for further study in science subjects. The park will go a long way in making the science concepts more clear in the students' minds. This will give them a fillip to go higher and higher in the areas of technology, engineering and mathematics. The park comprises various educational models providing physical representations of the topics taught in the classroom. **This park is the first of its kind in Kasaragod district, among schools.**

XVIII (b) ATAL TINKERING LABORATORIES (Robotics Lab)

Our school has set up ATL on our campus, aided by Central government. It is a programme run by Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), under National Institution for Transforming India (NITI Aayog). The objective of this scheme is to foster curiosity, creativity and imagination in young minds and develop skills such as design mindset, computational thinking, adaptive learning, physical computing etc. Our students will get a chance to work with tools and equipment to understand 'the what, how, and why' aspects of STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math). This is yet another feather on the cap of achievements on the campus.

XIX ADDITIONAL FACILITIES

1. Language Laboratory

A computerised state-of-the-art Language Laboratory is functioning effectively for improving proficiency in English Language of the students of classes V and above. The facility is available to them once a week.

2. Social Science Museum

Set up under the auspices of Social Science Club. Rare collections and contributions from various sources are aesthetically displayed.

3. Art Gallery

Where beautiful creations of the budding artists from among our students are displayed.

4. Band Troupe

A full-fledged band troupe is set up for boys.

5. Gymnasium

A modern 1st grade gymnasium for students and staff was inaugurated by Pujya Swami Tejomayanandaji on 17-12-'03. The Gym started functioning from 1st week of January, 2004.

XX SWIMMING POOL

A swimming pool is an added facility and attraction. Students are given regular training to learn the swimming skills.

XXI UNIFORM

(c) During rainy season, including Wednesday, black, (single colour) rain proof sandals, (as per model exhibited at school office) (without socks) should be used by all students of Classes Balvatika-I (PreKG) to Std. XII.
